Provide Support to Ukrainian Armed Forces

With the approval of Presidential Drawdown, focus shifts to delivery of materiel to Theater and coordination for delivery to Ukrainian Armed Forces for their use in Ukraine

- Material Handling & Life Support at Aerial Ports of Debarkation (APOD)
- Line Haul from Sea Ports of Debarkation (SPOD)
- Line Haul to Border Crossing Points
- Operator and Maintenance Training Support (Manual Translation / Linguists)

Due to high use and battle damage, U.S. established forward repair capabilities

- Life Support & Maintenance Area Support for U.S. Organic Maintenance (initial)
- Set Conditions for Establishment of Tele-maintenance Distribution Centers (multiple sites)
