Procurement Section Chief Finance and Facilities Division (FFD) Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI)

Paul Flood currently serves as the Bureau Procurement Chief for the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI). In his role, Mr. Flood oversees all FBI acquisitions, which average \$3.5B annually and include several Department of Justice (DOJ) wide large-scale initiatives such as all tactical and ammunition contract vehicles, ITSSS2, an \$8 billion IT services contract.

Mr. Flood began his career with the FBI in the Case Support Unit of the Victim Services Division, where he coordinated victim notification and outreach, as well as information and case management across investigations ranging from terrorism to criminal investigations. During this time, Mr. Flood joined the Victim Services Response Team and was appointed Incident Response Manager in many of the most infamous mass violence incidents occurring at the time. As Incident Response Manager, he directed the victim services on scene response and operations in the immediate aftermath of a crisis. It was during these incidents Mr. Flood was first introduced to the world of FBI acquisitions. Though Mr. Flood was primarily responsible for ensuring victims were afforded their legally mandated notifications on available rights and services, to fulfill this duty often required quick or unconventional acquisitions and a deep understanding of acquisition policy.

Mr. Flood then went on to become the first Procurement Unit Chief leading operations on the ground at Redstone Arsenal before he was appointed Deputy Bureau Procurement Chief in 2021 and later Bureau Procurement Chief in 2023.

Mr. Flood was born and raised in Philadelphia, PA and attended the University of Maryland – College Park where he obtained a Bachelor of the Arts in both Economics and Criminology & Criminal Justice.
